1.	To receive and accept apologies for absence Apologies were received from Cllrs Tara Barber (TB), Gavin May (GM), Marcia Morgan (MM) and marked as absent was David Terry (DT).		
2.	Declarations of Interest: Disclosure by Councillors of their personal interests in regard to matters on the agenda, and whether the councillor regards their interest as prejudicial under the terms of the Code of Conduct. JD declared an interest in item 10.1 (Swimming Pool). JK declared an interest in item 13.6 (LW/22/0472). RT declared an interest in item 13.1 (LW/22/0255) and item 13.6 (LW/22/0472).		
3.	Dispensation requests None received.		
4.	Minutes of previous meetings: To agree the minutes of the meeting held on 12 th July 2022. The minutes of the meeting held on 12 th July 2022 were accepted and signed by the the Chairman.		
5.	Public questions or comments: Up to 15 minutes (3 minutes per person) will be available for the public to make representations or questions. Please note that under Data protection regulations we ask members of the public to only state their name if they agree to their name being recorded. A member of the public spoke on the second application on the proposed estate LW/22/0472. She said that the developers, Gleasons, have a reputation for submitting an initial application which is destined to fail which allows them to make a second application which looks like they have made a compromise. She said much will be made on the reduction of the number of houses (75) but this is probably the number they were thinking of from the beginning. She asked for RPC's support in resisting this consistent assault on the village and to seek confirmation that these houses are to cover the whole site as, if so, this application should be rejected on the basis of underuse of land alone. The resident who has an application at item 13.2 (LW/22/0432) announced her presence and GS said JW would call upon her if necessary when this was being discussed.		
6.	If the Committee wishes to exclude the public for a particular agenda item, the following resolution must be passed: 'That under the Public Bodies (Admission to Meetings) Act 1960, the public and representatives of the press and broadcast media be excluded from the meeting during the consideration of the following items of business as publicity would be prejudicial to the public interest because of the confidential nature of the business to be transacted.' No exclusion required.		
7.	Reports from District and County Councillors (Up to 15 mins) Maria Caulfield, MP's report – this report was noted. East Sussex County Councillor – JD provided a report and asked to be contacted with any queries. Lewes District Council - EOB flagged up a few issues: Petition launched re. HGVs - She highlighted the petition that has been launched to route HGVs away from the village and urban areas and to keep to trunk and "A" Roads. The link is:

9.2	<p>Strategy Day – Update on setting up a meeting with Trevor Leggo (TL). GS explained that a Strategy Day was to do with asking what people want the village to look like in 20 to 30 years time. He said TL had previous experience and had offered his services at a cost of £200.00. GS suggested an evening when all Cllrs could attend (or as many as possible). Everyone was happy to proceed. 9.3	<p>RPC Assets of Community Value – To receive an update. AH confirmed that the swimming pool was now a community asset and we are awaiting decisions for Anchor Inn and Anchor Field Car Park. It was explained that the point of registering assets of community value is that once they are registered if the owner wishes to get rid of them there is a window of opportunity for the Community to put forward a proposition for them.</p>	
10.	<p>Highways Matters - To receive an update. SP said there was no update. She advised as to a rumour that the work at the Gliding Club is due to complete in August and they would be applying for retrospective planning. It was reiterated that this would at least give RPC the opportunity to vent.</p>	
11.	<p>Parish Road and Drains – To discuss Burwash Common & Weald Residents' Association (BCWRA)'s email of 22nd July 2022. It was agreed that RPC fully support their report and recommendations and share their concerns. ACTION: Council leader to write to the Lead Member for Transport at ESCC, Cllr Claire Dowling, and to the local County Councillor, to express RPC's views and to support this initiative for better road and drainage maintenance.</p>	CLERK/GS

12.1	<p>Parish Council's Assets Survey and bin audit - To receive an update. AH confirmed that the bin audit is now complete and she thanked the volunteers for their assistance with this. She said the office was investigating whether we are paying for the correct number of bins to be emptied. She said it would appear not.</p>	OFFICE

12.3	<p>Skatepark –to receive an update. JW confirmed he would ask for a revised quote once possible. ACTION: JW to contact Wendy Davies at Bendcrete to ask her to revisit the quote once the application has been validated.</p>	JW
12.4	<p>War Memorial Posts – to receive an update. 11 posts have been installed by Tony Read at a cost of £285.00</p>

12.7	<p>Village Green – To receive feedback on Play Park Grand Opening. GS stated that this had been a roaring success with Kompan providing ice cream, goodie bags and balloons. He said the play park was being well-used.</p>

SP advised that Jenny Martin had been asked to accelerate the timetable for Norlington Lane and that her response had been vague. JK said he just wanted to point out that RPC had supported this application and that this was the right decision, but it had been made on the wrong information. He said that 4 horses would be incinerated here a week but they would not be dealing with any stock. SP said that they would be storing around 50 dead animals and that 2 or 3 times a week these would be taken to a larger incineration facility.	JK/ALL
